Mubarak Promotes Peace

JERUSALEM (JTA) — President Hosni Mubarak of Egypt has sent a message to Premier Yitzhak Shamir expressing hope that Egypt and Israel would continue to cooperate to "promote peace in the area." The message was conveyed to Shamir by Energy Minister Moshe Shahal who returned from a visit to Egypt last week.

In Cairo, meanwhile, Mubarak told reporters that he expected Palestine Liberation Organization chairman Yasir Arafat to be in Egypt soon to discuss "further steps toward peace."

Imperial Palace Auto Collection Purchased Mrs. Packard's 1934 Packard Coupe

The Imperial Palace Auto Collection, housed on the fifth floor of the hotel's parking facility recently purchased the 1934 Packard coupe built especially for Mrs. James Ward Packard.

James Ward Packard (1863-1928), with his brother, William Doud, introduced the forerunner of Packard cars in Warren, Ohio, in 1899. The earliest model was called the "Ohio," but the name soon changed to Packard. From the 1899 partnership of Packard and Weiss, the firm name changed to Ohio Automobile Company in 1900, and to Packard Motor Car Company in 1903, the year the factory moved from Warren to Detroit. J. Ward Packard was president of the firm from 1900 to 1909.

Mr. and Mrs. James Ward Packard built their 32-room summer mansion in the tranquil village of Lakewood, N.Y., located on the shores of Chautauqua Lake in 1911-12.

At the lake, several Packard automobiles were housed on the grounds of the mansion. Mrs. Packard preferred to drive the 1934 Packard coupe for her daily errands. It was this car, which was recently acquired by the Imperial Palace Auto Collection, that had been equipped originally by the factory with blocks on the pedals and on the emergency brake handle to conform to Mrs. Packard's five foot two-inch frame.
