During the month of November, the Clark County Health District recorded one more case of acquired immune deficiency syndrome raising the total in Clark County to 45 since the disease was first identified in 1981. Three patients died last month bringing the total to 30 who have died from AIDS during the past four years.

The Health District offers AIDS antibody screening and encourages those who have engaged in high-risk activities to obtain a test. Counseling and coordination of services are also offered to those persons who are infected. An information hotline, 383-1393, is open 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday at the District Health Center. Anyone who wants more information about AIDS or services available to persons infected with the AIDS virus may call the hotline. All conversations are confidential. A National AIDS information number, 1-800-342-AIDS, is available 24 hours a day. Those who wish to volunteer time and assistance to AIDS patients may contact Aid for AIDS of Nevada (AFAN), 369-6162.

The UNLV dance department will offer a new mini-term class, titled "Performance for the Broadway Musical," Jan. 5-16.

The two-credit course will focus on specific musical numbers, audition techniques, acting and dance style of several major Broadway choreographers.
