Elaine Wynn, chairman of the UNLV Foundation, told the University of Nevada System Board of Regents that the Foundation received \$7,469,323 in donations and pledges in the past year.

"These contributions of cash and property have come from a wide variety of donors and are targeted for numerous programs and colleges at UNLV," Wynn said in her annual report to the regents at their meeting in Las Vegas.

The College of Business and Economics received the largest share of gifts with a total of \$2.15 million. The second largest amount of \$1.5 million was received by the College of Hotel Administration.


"The College of Arts and Letters received the third largest amount -- \$450,000 -- as a result of the emphasis on this year's university theme, The Year of the Arts," she reported.

Fourth on the list was the College of Science, Mathmatics, and Engineering which received a total of \$390,000.

UNLV President Robert C. Maxson's top priorities for this academic year have been in the areas of architecture, arts, and student scholarships, Wynn said, adding, "It has been gratifying to see how well the community has responded to these priorities." An additional \$1.6 million has been raised for the President's Margin of Excellence Fund, which addresses these specific goals.

"The Foundation board has never been more optimistic about UNLV than it is at this moment," she said. "The record-breaking enrollment, the increasing attendance by honor students, the strong support from many sectors of the community are all indications that UNLV is developing its academic potential."
