The Cactus Starts To Bud

A relatively frequent visitor to Las Vegas, Dr. Simon has developed an extreme fondness for Las Vegas and its Jewish community. Dr. Simon has been invited to be one of our guest speakers in our 1987 lecture series. After a recent visit to Las Vegas, Dr. Simon submitted an article about our city to several Jewish publications, including the L.A. B'nai B'rith Messenger, Jewish Press, and National Jewish Post and Opinion. The following is the text of that article by Prof. Simon,)

Last year I wrote about Las Vegas, a Jewish oasis deep in the Nevada desert. On a recent trip to attend the biennial B'nai B'rith International Convention, I found out that the cactus was starting to bud.

Dr. LeRoy Bernstein has recently become the first certified mohel in the history of the city. Dr. Bernstein, a pediatrician, came to Las Vegas in 1982 and soon realized that most of the "ritual" circumcisions were being performed by local doctors some of whom were not even Jewish. The closest mohel was 300 miles away in Los Angeles and he was rarely used.

Eventually, he was asked to perform circumcisions himself, but felt most uncomfortable about doing so since he did not have the proper halachic (Jewish Law) background. Ultimately Dr. Bernstein took the bull by the horns and spent a year receiving training in the rituals and laws of Brit Milah from Rabbi Samuel Zadok, an Israeli scribe and mohel now practicing in Los Angeles.

Most of the time was spent in home study, but he did attend practical sessions as well. Since he was well versed in the medical side of the procedure, he was able to progress more rapidly than most people. Finally, he was examined by a Bet Din (rabbinical court) under the auspices of the Rabbinic Assembly of Los Angeles and given Smicha (certification) as a mohel by them.

Dr. Bernstein is a member of the five year old orthodox Congregation Shaarei Tefilla and frequently attends its morning minyan. His ten year old son, Jay, who often accompanies him to shul, is an outstanding swimmer who has won many trophies in Nevada and California, and recently won the Nevada State Swimming Championship in the 10 year old division. His daughter, Melanie, is also an excellent swimmer and both Melanie and Jay are straight-A students. Melanie participated in a 6 week tour of Israel this past summer. Both children have attended the Hebrew Academy of Las Vegas.

While in Las Vegas I attended services at Shaarei Tefilla, and found them to be as heimish as ever. Several other visitors were also present, and as usual the members of the congregation provided us with transportation to and from our hotels.

Although the congregation still lacks a Rabbi, fund raising for a mikva (ritual bath), which was only a distant dream last year, is now under way, and their new building is already becoming crowded. Land for expansion, and a small building for the Hebrew school, have already been purchased.

Las Vegas is not for everyone -- not even for a visit -- but with Shaarei Tefilla, a religiously trained mohel, a day school, and a mikva on the way, a solid basis for a strong Jewish life seems to be present. The cactus is budding, I can't wait to see it in bloom.
