

Jews Who Don't Wish To Live There Come To Israel

JERUSALEM (JTA) — Premier Yitzhak Shamir called on the Soviet Union to "give us our two million brethren who no longer want to live there." He stressed that "We have no fight with the government or the people of the USSR."

Shamir spoke at a mass meeting of solidarity with Soviet Jewry here, also attended by Vice Premier and Foreign Minister Shimon Peres, leading Soviet Jewry activists who have immigrated to Israel and representatives of Israeli political parties.

Natan Shcharansky, one of the most famous of the activists, urged President Reagan to link all U.S. - Soviet negotiations with the issue of free emigration for Soviet Jews.

Meanwhile, President Chaim Herzog and Shamir received Chanukah greetings from six leading Soviet refuseniks. Their typewritten message, brought here by Robert Loup, a former United Jewish Appeal national chairman, drew an analogy between the struggle of the Maccabees and that of Jews in the Soviet Union.

The message was signed by Alexander Lerner, Maria and Vladimir Slepak, Lev and Tatiana Upshitzer and Yuli Kushrovsky. It said they were praying that "God will give us renewed strength to continue and that the Chanukah lights will illuminate the way for those of us who have problems in fulfilling our dream to go to Israel and to return home."

In his recent publication, Shalom Vision, Dr. Eiklor sounds this warning against the evangelical anti-Semites:

"Ominous rumblings are increasingly reported in both secular and Christian media. What they say is chilling. Some 75 dangerous groups preach hatred against Jews and other minorities. Many do it in the name of Christ and the Bible, using such names as 'Christian Identity' or the 'Church of Jesus Christ Christian.' Preachers in such groups teach that Jews, blacks, and other non-white groups are on a spiritual level of animals and that Jesus was not really a Jew. A white-supremist military camp was set up in Coeur D'Alene, Idaho, where 'Christian warriers' are trained to liberate America from the Jews and other 'racial inferiors.'

"A high-tech computer hook-up system links many of the organizations such as the Aryan Nations, The Order, Christian Defense League, Posse Comitatus, etc. All march beneath a common banner of racism with hate camouflaged in patriotic and even evangelical wrappings...Fifty years ago," Dr. Eiklor adds, "the step-by-step destruction of European Jews was taking shape in Europe. The Holocaust took place because the Christian Church -- on both sides of the Atlantic -- did nothing or too little, too late..."

The peril which these hate groups may pose to the United States was brought home last week at a specially-convoked press conference held at the American Jewish Committee's headquarters here in New York where leaders of major

Protestant and Roman Catholic religious organizatiaons joined the Jewish human relations agency of the AJC in denouncing the 'Christian Identity' movement as "a threat to a pluralistic and democratic America, a perversion of authentic religious values, and a source of bigotry, racism and anti-Semitism."



The evangelical Christian hate-mongers will find it hard-going in the face of the Pastor Russell-armed devotees who with the truly Biblical weapon of Truth as expounded by Russell, the great Christian friend and supporter of Israel, will silence and sink these anti-Jewish groups into oblivion.

TEL AVIV (JTA) — Security forces have uncovered and captured a gang of Moslem terrorists operating in the Gaza Strip, the IDF spokesman announced.



Christian Zionists Expose Evangelical Anti-Semites

He is a Past President of the American Friends of Hebrew University, serves on the University's International Board of Governors, is a member of the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Council, and is an International Governor on the Board of Yad Vashem in Israel.
