

Terrorists Renew Threats Against Lebanese Jews

apolitical for the simple reason that his profession had shaped his entire life." (In fact, one of his patients was the son of a prominent PLO leader.)

The Organization of the Oppressed has stated that it is still holding the following person: Isaac Sasson, 66, the President of the Lebanese Jewish community, who was kidnapped on March 31, 1985 on his way from the airport in West Beirut on his return from a business trip for the pharmaceutical firm he directed. It is generally believed that the group may also be holding Salim Jammous, 56, the secretary-general of the Lebanese Jewish community, who was abducted near the synagogue in West Beirut on August 15, 1984. Nothing is known of the whereabouts of Clement Dana, an elderly man who lived alone and disappeared in April 1985. The formation of a worldwide organization under

the name of "the Party of the Oppressed" was suggested by Ayatollah Khomeini during a meeting with the Syrian Foreign Minister on August 16, 1979, in which Khomeini declared it to be "the same as the 'Party of God' (Hezbollah.)" At a memorial meeting in New York on January 8, 1986 on behalf of the first two Jewish victims, the Rev. Joseph O'hare, S.J., President of Fordham University, poignantly declared: "It is once again a cruel irony that the murderers of Haim Cohen and Isaac Tarrab should dare to call themselves representatives of the oppressed of the world. No greater human oppression is possible than the reduction of individual human beings to nameless symbols whose lives are snuffed out in some sterile political gesture."

The classes are being co-sponsored by Humana Hospital-Sunrise, the American Heart Association and the Nevada Cooperative Extension.
