ADL Hails Supreme Court

NEW YORK, N.Y. — The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith hailed the U.S. Supreme Court action in a Nazi war criminal case as "paving the way for the deportation of Karl Linnas," the 67-year-old Greenlawn, N.Y., man accused of murdering men, women and children in a concentration camp in Nazi-occupied Estonia during World War II.

Abraham H. Foxman, ADL's associate national director and head of its International Affairs Division, said that "the swift deportation of Linnas would be more than an act of justice -- it would be a warning to present and future generations against the horrors of genocide and a reminder that apathy and indifference helped make the Holocaust possible."

The decision marked the second time the Court refused to review the U.S. Second Circuit Court of Appeals' deportation decision against Linnas. After the first refusal, on December 1, 1986, Linnas' attorneys had again petitioned the high court to hear the case.

The League's Task Force on Nazi War Criminals monitored Linnas' trial in 1981, at which his American citizenship was revoked on the grounds that he had covered up his Nazi past when he entered this country in 1951 and became a naturalized citizen 10 years later.

Deportation Of Gaza Strip Palestinian Sparks Demonstrations

Dahlan was the 15th Palestinian in the administered territories to be deported since August 1985 when Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin renewed the policy of expulsion for alleged pro-terrorist ac-
