Connie and Bobby Darin were very close friends she explained and being able to present Ron in "Legends in Concert" will help keep Bobby's memory alive. During the show, Connie talked about Darin while imparting some insight to the audience about his varied talents.

Connie's appearance marked a milestone in "Legends" history. It was the first time since the hit show debuted at the Imperial Palace in May, 1983, that a real, living, legendary superstar performed in the show.

The appearance marked a milestone for Connie as well. It was her first stage appearance in 15 months and her first Las Vegas nightclub appearance since 1970. After a round of thunderous applause, John Stuart presented Connie with a boquet of roses.

Catholics, Jews Agree To Improve Carmelite Convent Off Auschwitz

GENEVA (JTA) - witz-Birkenau to the Jewish and Catholic Holocaust. leaders meeting here agreed that a Carmelite convent established on the site of the Auschwitz-Birkenau death camp in Poland will be removed within two years.

The agreement is expected to resolve the emotionally charged issue first raised by European Jews, who regard the site as a unique symbol of the Holocaust. The agreement provided for the establishment, away from the camp site, of an interreligious center where Catholics and Jews can pray and meditate. seminars and greet visitors. The nuns will move off the Auschwitz site to a new building.

Theo Klein, president of the Council of Major French Jewish Organizations (CRIF). presided the meeting. Other Jewish participants were Tulia Zevi, president of the Italian Jewish community; Chief Rabbi Rene Sirat of France and Ady Steg, head of a committee opposed to the convent.

The Catholic Church was represented by Albert Cardinal Decourtray, Archbishop of Lyon; Jean-Marie Lustiger, Archbishop of Paris; Godfried Cardinal Danneels of Brussels; and Franciszek Cardinal Marcharski, Archbishop of Cracow.
