Elan Steinberg, executive director of the WJCongress, who participated in the meetings Bronfman and Abram held in Moscow, told the JTA that the Soviet officials agreed that all Jewish religious books from any source will be permitted to enter and be distributed to Jews in the Soviet Union.

"The Soviets asked the WJC to draw a list of all religious books they want to send into the Soviet Union and submit it to them. They did not place any limits on the quantity of the books. They only objected to books of a political nature,"
