will be held in Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Boulder City and Henderson. For those people who will be out-of-town and require an absentee ballot, requests for absentee ballots for the cities of Boulder City, Henderson or North Las Vegas should be directed to the respective City Clerk and for the City of Las Vegas residents, absentee ballot requests should be directed to the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas Boulevard South, Las Vegas, Nevada 89101. All absentee ballot requests must be received in the respective offices no later than April 28th.

In-office absentee voting will be available April 10th through April 28th for registered voters in Las Vegas, who may cast an absentee ballot at the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas Boulevard South. Persons requiring inoffice voting in the cities of Boulder City, Henderson or North Las Vegas should contact their respective City Clerk for the dates and hours of in-office voting. This means of in-office absentee voting is made available for those people who will not be in town on Election Day and will not be at any permanent address sufficiently long enough to receive an absentee ballot by mail.

After April 28th, absentee voting in-office will be restricted to persons attesting that an emergency situation exists. All absentee ballots must be returned to the issuing office by Election Day.
