## Woman Packs, Sends **Holiday Boxes**



Gordon was inspired to start Chag Sameach (Happy Holiday), a mailorder business that provides kosher packages on all the major Jewish holidays.

Orders have come from as far away as Ecuador and Japan, locations which are prohibitive for Gordon because of the high postage costs. "It's really a shame," she said. "These people need it the most."
