TEL AVIV (JTA) — The Supreme Court has set May 24 as the date to begin hearing an appeal by former Israel Defense Force Lt. Azzat Nafsu who is serving an 18-year prison sentence imposed by a military court in 1980 for alleged treason.

The top secret agency Shin Bet was involved in a scandal last year over the murder of two captured Arab bus hijackers by security agents in 1984. Three senior Shin Bet officials were given Presidential pardons before any charges were filed aginst them. One of them admitted the agency routinely fabricated evidence to protect itself.
