JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

BONN (JTA) — Chancellor Helmut Kohl, in his strongest public statement on the Nazi era, called the crime of genocide against the Jews a crime "unprecedented in history," declaring "we should keep alive the memory of the full extent of that terrible past" and "will oppose any attempts to dismiss them from our thoughts or belittle them."

The Chancellor's remarks, at a luncheon recently, in honor of the visiting President of Israel, Chaim Herzog, was seen as a warning against attempts by some West German scholars to equate the Nazi extermination of Jews with other crimes in modern history and by neo-Nazis to rewrite history by claiming the Holocaust never occurred.

JERUSALEM (JTA) — East European publishers, participating for the first time, attracted the most attention at the 13th International Book Fair here last week. They are among more than 1,000 publishers from 40 countries displaying over 100,000 books on all subjects. Crowds gravitated to the Polish stand where 300 books on display included many works of Judaica. Some dealt with the destruction of Polish Jewry in the Holocaust. Hungary, Rumania and Yugoslavia are also well represented at the book fair.

TEL AVIV (JTA) — The Diamond Institute has reported that Israel's exports of polished diamonds rose 26 percent during the first three months of 1987 compared to the same period last year. Value was up to \$510 million from \$406 million. Diamond dealers forecast a record year with sales of \$2 billion compared to \$1.7 billion in 1986.






