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Probe Waldheim's Wartime Activities

VIENNA (JTA) — Foreign Minister Alois Mock announced that Austria will set up a commission of historians to investigate the wartime activities of President Kurt Waldheim.

Waldheim himself intends to take legal action in response to allegations of his complicity in Nazi persecutions and atrocities. The allegations were the basis of the U.S. Department of Justice's decision, announced a week ago, to bar Waldheim from entry into the United States.

It is "time to respond to these slanders through legal channels," Waldheim said on a radio interview, but he did not specify what type of legal action he was considering.

Mock, who is Vice Chancellor and head of the conservative People's Party which ran Waldheim as its Presidential candidate last year, said the commission would be established after consultations with the President. He said it would comprise Austrian historians but could include foreign scholars approved by Waldheim. Mock also said that the "White Book" Waldheim commissioned to set straight details of his war record has been completed. He said it and the documents used to incriminate Waldheim, which the Austrian government has requested from Washington, would be made widely available.

Waldheim, who served for 10 years as United Nations Secretary General, has admitted to falsifying his military service record in his official autobiography. He claimed he was discharged from the German army in 1941 for a disability when actually he served as an intelligence officer in the Balkans. He has vehemently denied any involvement in atrocities against civilians or resistance fighters. But documents discovered in the archives of the United Nations War Crimes Commission state otherwise.

clusively Austrian, if it was to have credibility.

Any conclusions the panel drew would have to previously said there appeared to be no concrete evidence to link Waldheim with war crimes. If Waldheim was shown to have been involved, he would have to resign, and if not, the United citizen, Wiesenthal said.

One of the several tests this writer offered in his recent column -- "Glasnost, Has It a Meaning for Israel?" -- for the sincerity of the Soviet "open door" policy was the Kremlin's withdrawal of support for the terrorist and murderous PLO whose avowed aim is the destruction of Israel, a

UN member State.

"Glasnost" and Moscow's opening of a trickle of Jewish emigration have no real meaning so long as the Soviets publicly support and encourage the PLO, a so-called "liberation movement" whose sworn goal is the final solution a la Hitler of the Jewish people, the end of Israel as a nation by force of arms, as Yassir Arafat made it guite clear at the Algiers confab of the conspirators. "This unity," he stated, "is a victory for our people. We will get together and return to Al Quds (Jerusalem) ... '

With Moscow's role and that of the PLO being interchangable, one may wonder whether Mr. Shimon Peres still feels the need for an international conference where the Soviet Union will represent the PLO to be followed by direct talks where the PLO will represent the Soviet Union.

Egypt was quick to see the truth. How long will it take Mr. Peres and the likes of him to learn the same lesson?

Interestingly, one positive development emerged from the Algiers confab. Because of Arafat's double-dealings, his concessions made to the anti-Egyptian PLO factions whose spokesmen blasted Egypt over the Camp David accords, Cairo lost no time in closing the PLO ofbe binding for both sides, said Wiesenthal, who fices in both Cairo and Alexandria -- a surprise move that shook the PLO leadership.


