WASHINGTON (JTA) — Nazi-hunter Beate Klarsfeld believes that when efforts are made to bring Nazi war criminals to justice, it is most important "to go after ... those who gave the orders." But in

the case of Austrian President Kurt Waldheim, there is "a moral responsibility" to hold him accountable

for his Nazi background, Klarsfeld said in an interview on the ABC-TV "This Week With David Brinkley" program Sunday.

we have to take something, we have to learn something from what happened during the Second World War

...So how can we admit that people, Kurt George Kiesinger of Germany, the former Chancellor, and Waldheim can represent states today?" Klarsfeld said.

The Austrian Charge d'Affaires, Christian Prosl, who also appeared on the program, contended that Waldheim was barred from entering the U.S. without being proved guilty of charges that he was involved in Nazi persecutions and atrocities during World War II.
