The General Municipal Elections and County Special Bond Election will be held on June 2nd. For those people who will be out-of-town and require an absentee ballot, requests for absentee ballots for the cities of North Las Vegas, Boulder City, Henderson or Mesquite should be directed to the respective City Clerk and for registered voters of Las Vegas and the unincorporated area of Clark County, absentee ballot - requests should be directed to the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas Boulevard South, Las Vegas, Nevada 89101. All absentee ballot requests must be received in the respective offices no later than May 26th.

In-office absentee voting will be available May 12th through May 26th, excluding May 25th which is a holiday, for registered voters in Las Vegas and the unincorporated area of Clark County, who may cast an absentee ballot at the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas Boulevard South. Registered voters in North Las Vegas, Boulder City, Henderson or Mesquite should contact their respective City Clerk for the dates and hours of in-office absentee voting. This means of in-office voting is made available for those people who will not be in town on Election Day and will not be at any permanent address sufficiently long enough to receive an absentee ballot by mail.

After May 26th, in-office absentee voting will be restricted to persons attesting that an emergency situation exists.

All absentee ballots must be returned to the issuing office by Election Day.


