TEL AVIV (JTA) — Mystery compounded by confusion surrounds the 40-foot yacht Silco and its passengers, hijacked at sea off the Gaza coast, apparently by terrorists of the dissident Abu Nidal faction of the Palestine Liberation Organization.

The 17-ton vessel and its eight passengers -- six adults and two children -- were brought to Moslem West Beirut. At a news conference there, a spokesman for the Abu Nidal gang, Walid Khaled, claimed that some of the passengers carried Israeli passports and
