literature laureate Singer for more than 30 years. After meeting in the elevator of their apartment building, Singer asked Soyer to illustrate his books "A Little Boy in Search of God" and "Love and Exile," which were later published with another story in a volume entitled "Love and Exile," for which Soyer was the illustrator.
