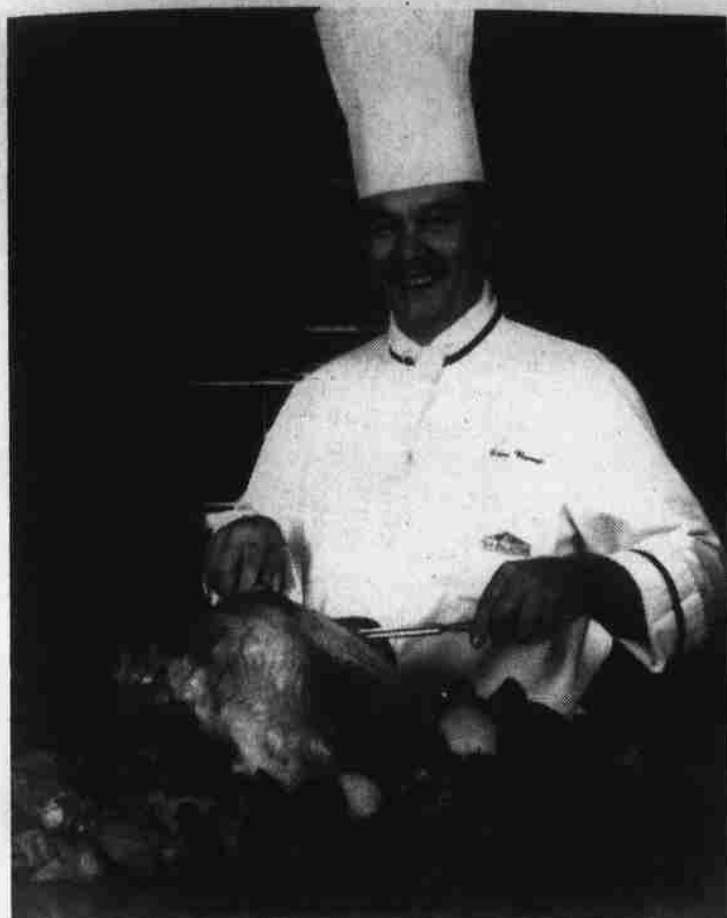


**Caesars Palace Restaurants

Caesars Palace's restaurants celebrate Thanksgiving with a grand variety of holiday favorites and exceptional gourmet delights. The Palace Court will offer a special brunch from 11 a.m. - 3 p.m., featuring Moet et Chandon champagne and piano entertainment. A five-course holiday dinner will be available in the Palace Court from 6 - 10 p.m. in addition to the customary a la carte menu.

The gourmet Bacchanal restaurant will offer an early American seven-course Thanksgiving feast in lieu of the regular menu, with seatings at 2, 4 and 6:30 p.m.

The Palatium buffet celebrates the day with a traditional American extravaganza from 10 a.m. - 10 p.m., with a wealth of freshly baked breads, salads, and fish. The carving station will offer prime rib, glazed ham and roast turkey with all the trimmings. Halibut steaks and duck legs a l'orange provide even more variety, along with a host of hot vegetables and soups. Pumpkin, mince, apple, lemon meringue, and assorted fruit and cream pies are only a few of the luscious desserts from the Palace pastry shop which will tempt guests. Thanksgiving buffet prices are \$9.95 for adults, \$5.95 for children under 12, and include choice of beverages. (Closed for breakfast).

The Primavera will serve two Italian harvest dinners in addition to the daily menu from 5 - 11 p.m. Breakfast (7:30 - 11:00 a.m.) and luncheon (11:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.) will be served as usual.

The 24-hour Cafe Roma coffee shop will feature a three-course turkey dinner from 11 a.m. - 11 p.m. in addition to the regular menu.

The Spanish Steps Steak and Seafood House will also offer a traditional Thanksgiving dinner in addition to its customary menu. Service will be from 5 - 11:30 p.m. on Thanksgiving Day.

The Ah-So Japanese steakhouse will be closed November 26.

The Las Vegas Symphony Orchestra will open its eighth season with a guest artist and a world premiere. The event at 2 P.M. on Sunday, November 22, will be the first of six scheduled subscription concerts under the baton of the Symphony's Music Director, Virko Baley.
