
R'nai B'rith Hails UN Decision To Open World War II Crime Files

WASHINGTON - B'nai B'rith hailed the United Nations War Crimes Commission for reversing its 1986 decision to bar the public from researching its World War II war crimes files.

In a letter to UN Secretary-General Perez de Cuellar, Seymour D. Reich, international president of B'nai B'rith, said the world's largest Jewish organization "welcomes the change of heart" by the commission's member states.

Reich concluded by saying B'nai B'rith trusts that the secretary-general "will act expeditiously to implement the commission's recommendation."

American Society For Technion Achieves Record Growth --Campaign Soars 87 Percent In Three Years

NEW YORK — The fundraising campaign of The American Society for Technion-Israel Institute of Technology (ATS) grew 87 percent in three years, Edward R. Goldberg, National President of ATS announced.

From 1984 to 1987, the campaign grew 87 percent, from \$12.8 to more than \$24 million as of September 30. ATS exceeded last year's campaign total by 14.3 percent.

"This is striking evidence that ATS is making an historic impact on the American Jewish community," Mr. Goldberg said. "It is an outstanding achievement in Jewish philanthropy."

"The unusual growth of the ATS campaign reflects a growing awareness that Technion, Israel's only comprehensive scientific and technological university, is central to hightechnology industrial development and exports essential for Israel's security and economic growth," Mr. Goldberg said. "More engineeringoriented research projects are conducted at Technion than at all other Israeli universities combined," he added.

Melvyn H. Bloom, Executive Vice President of ATS, noted that the Society provides more than 80% of all funds raised worldwide for Technion and that in this new academic year ATS has undertaken to provide nearly 20% of the Institute's operating funds.

He attributed the success of the ATS campaigns to "a growing community of vigorous leadership throughout the Society's eleven

regions nationwide."

"Those Jewish leaders most sophisticated about Israel's needs increasingly see the Technion at the center of Israel's growth and development," he said. "Technion is the womb where ideas are generated by the people who are building Israel's self-sufficiency," Bloom said.

More than 30,000 Technion scientists and engineers, educated in some 20 engineering sciences, architecture, town planning and in medicine are a major force in Israel's economy. Technion is a vital national resource.
