Grandpa, she tells us, always wears long sleeve shirts, even on hot days. But one evening after dinner he volunteers to do the dishes, rolls up his sleeves -- and his granddaughter sees for the first time the numbers on his arm. When she asks who put the numbers there and what they mean, Grandpa is reluctant at first to reply. But he realizes that the time has come to share his story with her and with the next generation.

The Holocaust is described in terms powerful enough to impress -- but not to frighten -- any young reader as Grandpa tells of the tragedy that befell him, his family and friends and the entire Jewish people. In simple and clear language he tells her about Jewish life in Europe, the rise of Hitler and the war against the Jews.

Finally, after a long silence, the girl tells her grandfather that he "shouldn't be ashamed to let people see your number...It's the Nazis who should be ashamed." In this way, the Holocaust is de-mystified and presented as part of the child's personal history, helping her understand her grandfather -- and herself.

The book is illustrated by a number of beautiful photographs by Rose Eichenbaum, a daughter of Holocaust survivors, taken of her own seven-year-old daughter, and of the grandfather, who is an actual Holocaust survivor.

Charlotte Jacobson, treasurer of the Jewish National Fund, participated in the recent reception of Ida Nudel, freed Soviet prisoner of conscience, at Lod Airport in Tel Aviv, Israel.

Commenting on the experience in an interview at JNF headquarters in New York City, she stated, "I felt as though I were in the presence of a great personality. The modesty of this woman was incredibly moving."

When asked about Soviet motives for freeing the famed refusenik, Mrs. Jacobson said, "The Soviets are attempting to create a more favorable world opinion of their human rights policy, to soften the impact of demonstrations when Soviet leader Gorbachev visits the U.S. for the summit meeting with President Reagan."

Mrs. Jacobson is a member of the international Steering Committee for Soviet Jewry and the National Conference on Soviet Jewry. Her last trip to Russia was in 1985, the second time she visited that country, when she held discussions with refuseniks striving to emigrate to Israel despite years of harassment and problems obtaining exit visas.
