# Israel Calls For Peace

## Riviera Hotel Site For Super Sunday '88

The Jewish Federation of Las Vegas will hold its Super Sunday Phone-a-thon and Community-Wide Convention on Sunday, Jan. 10, from 10 a.m. - 8 p.m. at the Riviera Hotel.

The Riviera has graciously provided space in its beautiful East Wing Convention area for the phone-a-thon and convention. The entire community is invited to come by the Riviera and visit.

More than 600 volunteers, representing the five local synagogues, local Jewish organizations and institutions will be manning offices and telephones, trying to reach every Jewish household in Las Vegas.

These volunteers will be asking the Jewish community of Las Vegas to show their support of the humanitarian programs of the Federation and the United Jewish Appeal (UJA) by making a pledge to the Federation/UJA Campaign '88.

The Jewish Federation of Las Vegas is an umbrella organization where community priorities are developed. The Federation allocates and coordinates services in response to local needs

WASHINGTON (JTA) — Two high-level Israeli Cabinet members defended their government's handling of the recent unrest in the administered territories and, in separate appearances recently on morning television talk shows, called on Arab nations to join the peace process to determine the future of those areas.

Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin, speaking on NBC's "Meet the Press," observed that Israel could have annexed the West Bank and Gaza Strip years ago, but, instead of unilaterally determining the fate of those territories, has left them open for future negotiation.

"Obviously today it's clear, more than ever before, that only a political, peaceful, diplomatic settlement" can resolve the Arab-Israeli conflict, Foreign Minister Shimon Peres said on the CBS program "Face the Nation."

Peres also played down the sympathy strike and protests staged by Arabs living in Israel. The foreign minister said he met recently with a group of Israeli Arabs who told him that violence would accomplish nothing.

"They, like us, understand that we should not turn to riots and hatred and violence, which will lead to nowhere," he said.

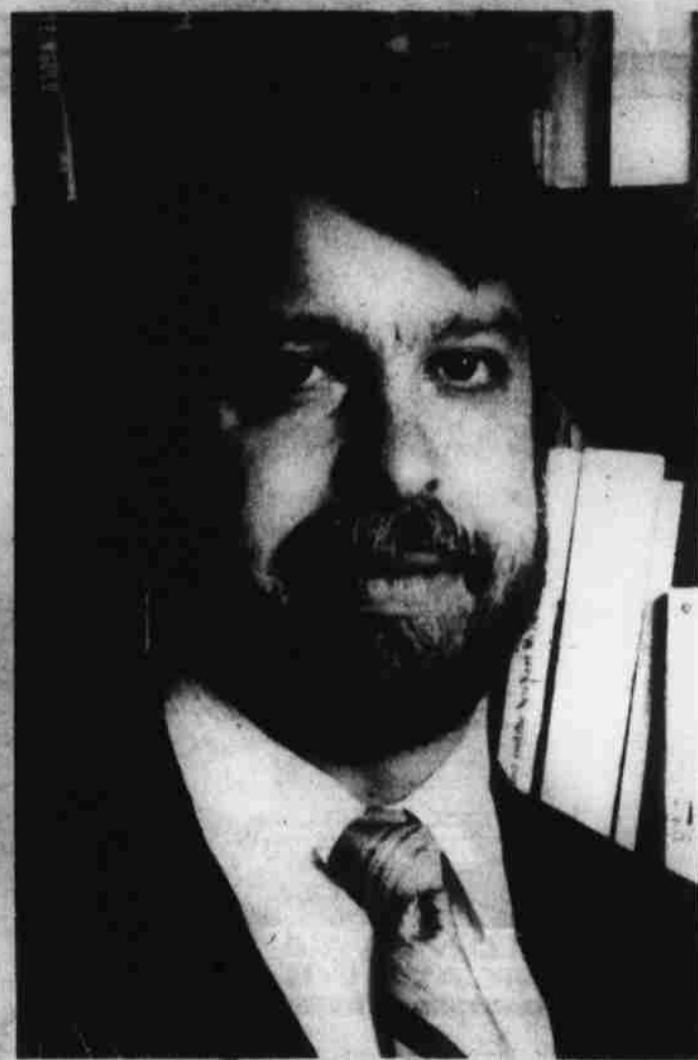
