Expulsion Of 5 Palestinians Postponed

New York Friars Club Honors Barbara Sinatra May 14 - Lee Iacocca Emcees Star-Studded Dais At Black-Tie Gala

The New York Friars Club dinner-tribute to Barbara Sinatra as their "Woman of the Year," a black-tie gala in the Grand Ballroom of the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel to be held Saturday evening, May 14, will be one of the most star-studded events in the Club's history, it was announced by Jack L. Green, Dean of the famed fraternal organization.

David W. Tebet, the evening chairman and producer has set a galaxial group, starting with M.C.-Toastmaster Lee Iacocca, who will introduce a dais comprised of Frank Sinatra, Dean

TEL AVIV (JTA) — Israel will postpone the deportation of five Palestinian activists in order not to risk new disturbances in the currently calm administered territories, Yediot Achronot reported recently.

The newspaper said the decision was made following consultations between Premier Yitzhak Shamir, Foreign Minister Shimon Peres and Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin. A second major factor was the Foreign Ministry's warning that the deportation beyond the four made January 13 would further harm Israel's image abroad.

Pressure from the United States was another factor, Yediot Achronot said. Deportation orders were issued on January 3 against nine Palestinian activists accused by the military of incitement to riot in the administered territories.

Four, from the West Bank, were expelled to Lebanon. Deportation proceedings were pending against the remaining five — one from the West Bank and four from the Gaza Strip. The Gazans announced they would waive their right to appeal on grounds they could not expect justice from Israeli courts.

The four deportees also had waived their right to appeal.
