## New Charges Against Waldheim

### KLAS-TV Asks "Kids" To Respond To Dan Rather's '48 Hours' Program About Las Vegas

Las Vegas, concerned over the recent CBS News broadcast of "48 Hours in Las Vegas," will have a chance to make a positive statement to the television network. KLAS-TV, Channel 8, the network's local affiliate, is organizing "Kids for Las Vegas" a response campaign from the children of the community.

"We want to hear from the kids of Las Vegas," said KLAS Vice President and General Manager Lem Lewis. "The segment of the program portraying Las Vegas children as neglected, street-wise kids drew the biggest response of all. We don't think it was an accurate portrayal of our youth, and we want CBS to know that."

KLAS is asking kids kindergarten through sixth grades to write letters of not more than one page telling why Las Vegas is a good place for kids. The letter writer's name and address should be on the same page as the letter. The author of one letter will be chosen by a panel of judges to

VIENNA (JTA) — Austrian President Kurt Waldheim allegedly attended the execution of 104 Albanians by the Nazis in 1944, according to new charges reported in two Yugoslav newspapers.

Meanwhile, a German historian researching Waldheim's military record could not locate in Yugoslavia a document said to link Waldheim to deportations of Yugoslav civilians to labor and death camps.

While Waldheim's office denied the new charges, the president conceded in an interview with a Vienna daily that the document indicating he was aware of the deportations, which the German magazine Der Spiegel published last week, may be correct, although he does not remember anything.

### Teachers Urgently Needed In Israel

The TOVS Organization, which is based in New York City, has the pleasure of announcing on behalf of the Department of Education & Culture of the WZO, the Israeli Ministry of Education and ORT that volunteer teachers are needed to tutor English in Israel for the summer of 1988. Part-time assignments will be available in various ORT schools, WIZO centers and public schools in Jerusalem, Haifa, Tel-Aviv and Netanya.

Since 1974, TOVS (Teachers on Volunteer Service), an organization of licensed teachers from the United States, has sent over 500 of their teachers to work in the various schools in Israel, especially in Tel-Aviv, Haifa and Jerusalem. During the regular sabbatical year from September to June, TOVS teachers have been requested for positions in smaller cities and development towns throughout Israel. This group of American educators, who have, each summer, taken a busman's holiday from their regular jobs, have come to Israel at their own expense to work for ORT and other Ministry of Education centers. TOVS, now in its 15th year of service to Israel, is expanding its activities and influence throughout Israel. There are many more teaching assignments in the Holy city of Jerusalem, as well as in Tel-Aviv and Netanya. We also have many more resources for room rentals in the \$200-350 per month category, especially in Jerusalem. This summer of 1988, TOVS will be sending a group of teachers under the leadership of Ellen Arrow, Assistant Director of TOVS to Ashkelon as part of a special English language program under the auspices of the Ministry of Education in Ashkelon. Room rentals will be arranged at about \$200 per month, and teachers will receive academic guidance and VIP treatment from the Israeli coordinators there.

The teachers have found their work rewarding beyond any previous teaching experience they have had. TOVS participants have been honored for their work at receptions with the late Golda Meir; Ephraim Katzir, former President of Israel; Mrs. Leah Rabin, wife of the former Prime Minister of Israel; Mrs. Ofira Navon, former First Lady of Israel, and Mr. Chaim Herzog, President of the State of Israel and former Israeli Am-
