Health Fair '88 The Month Of MARCH

KTNV-13 and Centel are proud to announce Health Fair '88.

During the month of MARCH, free health screenings will be provided to residents of Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City at various locations throughout Southern Nevada.

The Health Fair will provide 13 free medical screenings: height, weight, blood pressure, EKG, pulmonary functions, visual acuity, glaucoma, hearing, skin cancer, oral cancer, exercise education, foot screening, and a health risk appraisal.

No blood tests will be administered at Health Fair this year, but the public will have the opportunity to receive optional laboratory tests at a reduced cost. The tests include urinalysis, blood count, basic blood chemistry, and a coronary risk profile. Those interested in taking the tests may pay for them at Health Fair, then have the procedure administered at a designated testing center.

"Health Fair serves a dual purpose; to provide health screenings for those who might not otherwise have received them, and to in-

crease the individual's awareness of their responsibility for their own health care," said KTNV's General Manager Jim Behling.

Health Fair is being co-sponsored by major Southern Nevada hospitals, including University Medical Center, Boulder City Hospital, St. Rose de Lima Hospital, Humana Hospital Sunrise, Community Hospital and Desert Springs Hospital.
