forever, secure and in peace...But the definition of peace cannot mean Palestinians continuing war to the death. And they too must feel hard pressure to do some ceding, specifically of their demand for another Palestinian state in a region where one already exists, and to negotiate in peaceful stages for the eventual goal: a single Jordanian-Palestine.

Americans have a right to criticize Israel, Rosenthal concludes, "they have a right to suggest solutions - but not the suggestion of suicide."

These thoughts were echoed at the Bnai Zion Dinner also by Morris B. Abram, the recipient of the 11th Annual Harris J. Leving Memorial Award. Having just returned from a two-week visit to Israel, he spoke highly of IDF's handling of the riots. "All occupations remain as such," he stated. "until a peace is signed," but, he added, "the Palestinian-Arab answer has been unchanged since Khartoum's three notorious no's. Noting the unceasing Arab onslaughts through the years, he cited the Hagadda which, he said, states that "in every generation an enemy arises in an attempt to destroy the Jewish people..." But this writer feels that in Israel's present dilemma, there too will come rescue from above which will allow her to triumph over her enemies and her true friends to rejoice together with her in a new "Seder (order)" in the Middle East, as prophesied by the great Isaiah.

Britain, Argentina Said To Take Steps Against War Criminals

LOS ANGELES (JTA) — The governments of Britain and Argentina are taking steps to bring to justice suspected Nazi war criminals residing in those countries, the Simon Wiesenthal Center reported here recently.

The center added in statements that it is actively cooperating in those endeavors.

The Argentine authorities are gathering evidence for the extradition to West Germany of Josef Schwammberger, according to the center.

He has been identified by Holocaust survivors as the SS commandant of the Rozwadeva ghetto and the Przemysl forced labor camp in Poland, responsible for the deportations and mass murder of Jews and others during World War II.

The British government is preparing to send a panel of two judges to the Soviet Union and other countries to investigate charges against suspected war criminals living in the

United Kingdom, according to the center.

"If sufficient grounds for prosecution exist, the government of Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher would move to amend the criminal code, which would set the stage for war crimes trials in the United Kingdom by the summer of 1989," according to Efraim Zuroff, director of the Wiesenthal Center's Israel Office.

Zuroff was informed of the British government's intentions at a meeting in London with David Faulkner, under-secretary of state at the Home Office. Faulkner said the panel of investigatory judges will consist of Sir Thomas Hetherington and William Chalmers, both retired law enforcement officials.

Last week, Wiesenthal Center legal counsel Martin Mendelsohn was in Buenos Aires to present government officials with additional evidence against Schwammberger, who has been in custody since his arrest late last year in Cordoba province.

After meeting with Minister of Justice and Education Jorge Sabata and Secretary of Justice Enrique Paixo, Mendelsohn said he has "every confidence" that Schwammberger will be extradited to West Germany.

The Bonn government has had a warrant out for his arrest for years. If extradited, he is expected to be tried by the war crimes court in Dusseldorf.

The steps contemplated by the British government will be in line with measures already taken by
