1938 - 1988: "Genocide" Premieres At Vienna's Urania Theatre



The Simon Wiesenthal Center's Academy Awardwinning Holocaust film "Genocide" premiered March 12 in Vienna, under the patronage of Dr. Hilde Hawlicek, Minister for Education, Sports, and the Arts, and Dr. Helmut Zilk, Mayor and Governor of Vienna. This dramatic photograph of the Urania theatre was taken in March 1938 at the time of the Anschluss. Distinguished and eminent personalitites from all segments of Austrian life came together 50 years later for this special event, part of a series of observances taking place in Vienna to mark the anniversary of the Anschluss.

The Home of the Good Shepherd has served the Las Vegas area for more than 25 years, and provides 24-hour residential care.
