Board Of Jewish Education Offers Special Educational Items For Passover

Want a record for your children that explains the story of Passover? Or how about a haggadah that's also a collector's item? At the Seder table on the first night of Passover, Jewish children around the world will ask the traditional question, "Why is this night different from all other nights?" Unfortunately, according to the Board of Jewish Education of Greater New York (BJE), many parents may not know the answers.

To help parents relate the many joyous traditions and stories of a holiday which marks the Jewish exodus from Egypt -- and the importance of both physical and spiritual freedom -- the BJE offers a wide variety of educational items. These materials are designed to guide parents who have little or no knowledge about the origins of the holiday and are unfamiliar with many of the Passover traditions.

Along with the many educational items the BJE offers are two unique haggadahs, which are also collector's items. The Sarajevo Haggadah has been used by graphic artists in calligraphy classes as a sample of the finest Hebrew Sephardic calligraphy ever written. This 14th Century haggadah is a replica of the original, housed in the National Museum of Sarajevo in Yugoslavia. Included with the haggadah is an English study guide summarizing the seder and explaining the full-color illustrations. Regularly priced at \$75, it is available at BJE for \$35.

Sharansky Inducted Into Israeli Army

TEL AVIV (JTA) — Former refusenik Natan Sharansky was inducted into the Israel Defense Force recently, little more than two years since his arrival in Israel, after spending nearly a decade in Soviet prisons and labor camps.

Sharansky spent his first day in the army learning how to dismantle a rifle. The 40-year-old Soviet Jewry activist will undergo a shortened basic training period and then be posted to the reserves.

Dressed in ill-fitting fatigues, Sharansky told a television interviewer that he would not shirk military duty, even though he has been offered a job as a lecturer in the IDF education corps.

Sharansky, probably the most famous refusenik and advocate of Jewish emigration rights, served nine years in the Soviet Gulag on charges of spying for the United States. He was released in February 1986 in a U.S.-Soviet spy exchange.

In the course of his trek, we witness the baking of matzah, participate in a seder with members of a kibbutz, and join a pilgrimage to Jerusalem which culminates at the Western Wall.

For a historical background on Passover, "Mostly Matzah," on record or cassette, brings to life the ancient story of Passover and its contemporary celebration in terms children can easily understand and enjoy. The record includes such favorite songs as "Ma Nishtanah" and "Dayenu" in Hebrew, and is available for \$9.98.

For families unsure of the melodies sung during the Seder meal, "Seder Melodies," begins with the candle lighting and presents the songs of the entire Seder meal, ending with the concluding Seder song "Had Gadya." The complete package includes lyrics in Hebrew with English transliteration, for \$11.98.

All of BJE's items have been screened by panels of educators to ensure lasting Judaic and educational value. In addition, orders can be shipped anywhere in North America.
