

NEW YORK (JTA) — Some 600 North Americans were scheduled to depart for Israel to perform various chores for two weeks at Israeli military bases and hospitals -- voluntarily.

According to Giat, this group of volunteers is the largest ever to go to Israel at one time. Four hundred and sixty-one of them will fly aboard a chartered El Al jumbo jet, and 35 more people whom the jet cannot accommodate will travel on a regularly scheduled flight. Another 50 have already left and 40 more are to fly directly from Los Angeles.

Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino Preparing For "The Auction"



"THE AUCTION" will be held April 23-24 at the Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino.

It is simply called "THE AUCTION" but it has drawn the attention of buyers and sellers of antique and classic automobiles worldwide. The Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino is once again preparing for "THE AUCTION" scheduled for April 23-24.

Last year, the first antique and classic car auction drew over 7,500 participants who bid on nearly 500 cards. "THE AUCTION," one of the world's richest and most successful, set three world records in 1987, including the most money to exchange hands in a two-day auction. This year's auction could rival the success of last year's event.

"We had a good selection of cars last year, but I think this year will be even better," said Hagan Stewart, general manager of "THE AUCTION." "We have been getting great response from those who were here last year as well as from people who are looking to attend the auction for the first time."

Last year, bidders from 17 foreign contries, including Japan, Switzerland, England, France, Greece, Italy and Germany, bid on nearly 500 selected vehicles from private collections as well as from the Imperial Palace Auto Collection and the Blackhawk Collection.

"THE AUCTION" features a no-reserve format in which there is no minimum bid and every car is sold to the highest bidder regardless of its price. The average price of a car during last year's auction was \$40,000. Cars were auctioned off at a pace of 35 per hour.

Among the early entries is a one-of-a-kind 1932 Hispano Suiza J-12 by "Binder" which could very well be auctioned off for close to \$1.5 million. Other classics include a 1928 Mercedes SS Tourer, a 1915 Rolls Royce Silver Ghost Town Car, a 1939 Buick Special Roadster with just 20,000 miles on it, a 1930 Duesenberg Model J La Grande Limo and a 1962 Rolls Royce PV James Young Touring Limo. In addition, there will be several 1950s Cadillacs and a wide variety of autos from the 20s, 30s and 40s which should draw the interest of major buyers worldwide.

"THE AUCTION" is again expected to attract a number of celebrities as either buyers or sellers. Cars belonging to Lucille Ball, Dean Martin, Steve McQueen, Will Robers and Amelia Earhard went on the auction block while personalities John Madden, Michael Nesmith, formerly of the Monkees, and Ken Kragen, manager of such entertainers as Kenny Rogers, were in the bidding audience.


UNLV is offering basic insurance classes for agents, brokers, and solicitors who need to fulfill pre-licensing educational requirements.
