
Experienced Stunt Men Fill Cast Of "Hot April Night Spectacular"

Stunts will be nothing new to cast members of the Michael Martin Hollywood Stunt Show production "A Hot April Night Stunt Spectacular" when the action starts on Friday, April 1, at 7:30 p.m. at the Sam Boyd Silver Bowl.

Beginning with producer Michael Martin, who has appeared in more than 30 action films, experience is one thing the show won't lack.

"It takes more than one person to handle stunts, and I'm proud to be associated with some of the most dependable men in the business," said Martin, who has performed stunts in such feature films as "Silverado," "El Dorado," "Eddie Macon's Run" and "Runaway Train."

Special effects will be created and executed by Pat and Kelly Kerby of Kerby Bros. Produc-

tions. In addition to their film work, the brothers have done acting and handled technical duties for television and film production as well as commercials. Anther Kerby Bros. performer, Danny Owen, has screen credits for high falls, motorcycle spills, car rolls and other stunts. He has appeared in the current TV series "High Mountain Rangers" and, like the brothers, is a licensed pyrotechnic operator.

Others who will appear in the "Stunt Spectacular" include Las Vegan Don Helm, who appeared in "Vegas," "Kojak" and "BJ and the Bear" and is an experienced stunt driver and technical aide; Joe Wilkerson, whose credits go as far back as "Branded" with Chuck Connors all the way to his current work as a regular in the popular "Crime Story" series; and Wally Hawkins, a second degree black belt whose martial arts skills have made him a hot commodity with both film and television production companies. Hawkins has appeared in stunt specials on television where he takes part in hair-raising races on a skateboard while being towed by a car and jumping over vehicles.

He noted that all of the attacks The accusation was carried out by Al Fatah, the main branch of the PLO headed by Yasir bassador to the United Arafat; "all were directed against civilians in the heart of Israel; all were timed to scuttle Javier Perez de Cuellar. progress toward peace negotiations, as is readily apparent by the attempt to murder Secretary Shultz."

Netanyahu was referring to a boobytrapped car discovered near Shultz's hotel in Jerusalem. It was safely dismantled. He also referred in his letter to an attempted carbomb attack early last month in the Israeli town of Kfar Saba.

He noted that three PLO terrorists were intercepted two weeks ago on their way to murder civilians in the city of Netanya. A similar gang was waylaid on the way to Malkiya in Galilee, near the Lebanese border, to seize hostages, Netanyahu claimed.
