Jackson Gives Jews Jitters

Israel Independence Day Unites Community In Support Of Israel

The headline entertainer for the day will be Avshalom Katz from Los Angeles. Additional entertainment will be provided by "Limelight Music and Entertainment, Ltd." from Scottsdale. Israeli songs and music for Israeli folk dancing will be featured.

Israeli food offered will be falafel, hummus, pita bread, bourekas (pastry filled with spinach

WASHINGTON (JTA) — The Rev. Jesse Jackson's stunning victory in the Michigan caucuses is causing increasing concern in the Jewish community, although no one expects him to end up as the Democratic nominee for the presidency.

Jackson won 55 percent of the vote in Michigan recently, nearly twice as much as Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis, who garnered only 28 percent of the vote.

This has led to increased media speculation that Jackson, who now has 598 delegates, only six fewer than Dukakis, could win the nomination at the Democratic National Convention in Atlanta in August.

"I don't think there is any chance of Jackson being on the ticket," said Morris Amitay, former executive director of the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) and a close observer
