Hadassah Mission Celebrates Israel's 40th Anniversary

NEW YORK — More than 150 members of Hadassah from throughout the United States will tour Israel this month (June) during a special Presidential Mission celebrating the 40th anniversary of the Jewish state.

Ruth W. Popkin, National President of the women's Zionist organization, will lead the mission on an itinerary that ranges from the Golan Heights in the north to Jericho in the south and explores Israel's ancient past as well as the trials and triumphs of 40 years of nationhood.

Israeli President Chaim Herzog, Deputy Prime Minister and former President Yitzhak Navon and Knesset Speaker Shlomo Hillel are among the top government officials who will meet with mission participants during the 14-day event.

In addition, Moshe Kol, one of the few living signers of Israel's declaration of statehood, will recall the dramatic events of 1948 in a special program at Independence Hall in Tel Aviv. Jerusalem Mayor Teddy Kollek will present each mission participant with a 40th Anniversary Certificate, and the group will also be greeted by Tel Aviv Mayor Shlomo Lahat before touring the 40th Anniversary Exhibition at the city's fairgrounds.

The mission's itinerary includes a tour of the Golan Heights and the ancient town of Gamla in the north, and a visit south to Beersheva and David Ben Gurion's home in Sde Boker, as well as a visit to Jericho, near the Dead Sea.

Mission participants will also tour the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center at Ein Karem, the Hadassah-University Hospital on Mount Scopus, and other sites in the network of projects in health care, career education, youth welfare and and reclamation that the organization maintains in Israel.

Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, is the largest Jewish women's volunteer group in the United States and the largest Zionist organization in the world.

The report in the West German daily Die Welt said the case of Professor Markus Klinkberg, reportedly sentenced in 1983, was discussed by Foreign Minister Shimon Peres with Soviet officials whom he met in Madrid this week while attending a meeting of the Socialist International Council.

According to Die Welt, Klinkberg's release was Moscow's precondition for restoring normal relations with Israel.

The 60-year-old biologist came to Israel as an emigrant from the Soviet Union. He was deputy director general of the Biological Institute in Ness Ziona.
