## Engelstad Protesters Attacked

### Goodwill Appoints New Executive Director

Goodwill Industries of Southern Nevada, a non-profit agency serving the handicapped of Las Vegas, is proud to announce the appointment of its new Executive Director, Irene Lemley.

The demonstration on Thursday, November 10th at 5:20 p.m. outside the Imperial Palace Hotel turned into a violent brawl. The most seriously injured was Emmanuel Meimarakis, an anti-Nazi demonstrator who was wearing a "Never Again" button. He was rushed to Desert Springs Hospital suffering from a separation between his cheekbone and his skull as one of the Las Vegas Skinheads hit him with his skateboard. He also was hit in the leg. Emmanuel Meimarakis, a devout Christian, was trying to help a woman who had been roughed up by the skinheads when he himself was attacked.

This recent demonstration was organized by individuals in the community to mark Veterans Day and to mark the 50th anniversary of the Night of Broken Glass (Kristallnacht) known as the beginning of the Holocaust. Coincidentally, a student/teacher conference entitled, "Kristallnacht - 50 Years Later" was being held at the Holiday Inn at the same time of the demonstration.

The confrontation was reminiscent of when white supremacists and skinheads clashed with civil rights activists on the "Gerald" television show, recently.

The demonstration was in protest to Ralph Engelstad, owner of the Imperial Palace Hotel, and his multimillion dollar collection of Nazi-era memorabilia, his so-called "War Room," two Adolf Hitler birthday parties he threw at the hotel and bumper stickers that were found at the Imperial Palace stating, "Hitler Was Right."

The State Gaming Control Board may file a complaint with the Nevada Gaming Commission against Ralph Engelstad. ### Reagan, At Wiesenthal Dinner, Proclaims Commitment With Israel

LOS ANGELES (JTA) — Looking back 50 years on the horrors of Kristallnacht in Nazi Germany, President Reagan pledged his country's vigilance "in the battle against those who would follow Hitler's example" and declared that Americans "have no better friends than the people of Israel."

In a departure from his prepared text, Reagan announced that he will shortly sign legislation which will finally allow American participation in the international convention against genocide.

Reagan's remarks were frequently interrupted by extended applause from 2,000 supporters of the Simon Wiesenthal Center, who were at a dinner to mark Wiesenthal's 80th birthday and to confer the center's 1988 Humanitarian Award on the president.

Reagan used the occasion to reiterate the need for a strong U.S. defense posture. "The fact is that a strong Israel depends on a strong America," he said.

Such strength and resolve, he added, "coupled with diplomatic vision and a commitment to political reconciliation, are essential if Israel is to help achieve a negotiated settlement among the war-weary people of the Middle East."

The president reviewed relations between Israel
