Following a career in business, Congresswoman Vucanovich became the Northern Nevada Representative to Senator Paul Laxalt from 1974 to 1982. She was first elected to the Nevada House of Representatives in 1982 and is now serving her fourth term. The Congresswoman has served on the Coalition for Soviet Jewry and attended the 1988 ADL Congressional Study Mission in Israel.

Irwin Suall is Director of the Fact-Finding Department of the Anti-Defamation League. Working with the League's 31 regional offices, Mr. Suall has the job of uncovering the facts about the promoters of bigotry, Arab propagandists, and the full range of anti-Semitic and hate-mongering extremists of the far-right and far-left. He is the author of "The American Ultras" and numerous ADL studies and reports on anti-Semitism and extremism. He is widely regarded as one of the foremost authorities on extremism in the United States.

Las Vegas Israelite Danes Arrest Six Suspected Of Stealing For Terror Group

COPENHAGEN (JTA) — Police arrested six Danish citizens recently for robbing millions of dollars to be routed to a Palestinian terrorist organization.

Approximately \$10 million is said to have been directed to the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine, a Palestine Liberation Organization faction led by George Habash.

Five men and one woman were charged with participation in several robberies that took place in and around Copenhagen between 1980 and 1983. In addition, they were charged with the kidnapping and attempted ransom of a bank director in July 1980. That attempt was aborted when the bank director was unable to open his safe and a gang of three men fled the scene, leaving the man tied up in a

cellar. Four of the men and the 35-year-old woman are Danish natives. A fifth man is a Jordanian native who became a naturalized Danish citizen.

The well-planned arrest operation took place after many months of surveillance and years of research by the Copenhagen police.

The six Danes were charged under an infrequently used Danish law that makes it a crime to give economic assistance to an organization dedicated to the violent disturbance of the social order. They pleaded not guilty to the charges. Danish law stipulates that the perpetrators may not be identified.

The PLO spokesman in Copenhagen, Abdul Rahman Allawi, said the PLO did not have any connection to or receive support from the robbers, and that the PLO does not support terrorist activities, robberies, hostage-taking or murder.

"The only fight we have is with Israel in the occupied territories," he said.

Organization factions based in Syria.

The situation in Lebanon is "very, very intractable," Baker said, but he called the Arab-Israeli conflict the most intractable foreign policy dispute.

The State Department singled out Syria when it called for an end to the "indiscriminate shelling" in Beirut. Baker said this was only the second time that the United States has criticized Syria as the chief foreign force instigating violence in Lebanon.

"The problem of determining who is the aggressor in this particular situation is extraordinarily difficult," he said. "You have Arabs fighting Arabs and you have Christians fighting Christians in Beirut today."

At the hearings, Helms ordered aides to distribute pictures of the Sukhoi-24 D bombers to committee members and reporters.

He also arranged to have large posters displayed of the plane, a Middle East regional map with a circle denoting the plane's radius and the alleged Libyan poison gas plant.

The State Department, on April 5, had refused at first to confirm or deny the Soviet bomber sale. The next day, however, deputy department spokesman Richard Boucher said that a Soviet foreign ministry spokesman had confirmed the sale.

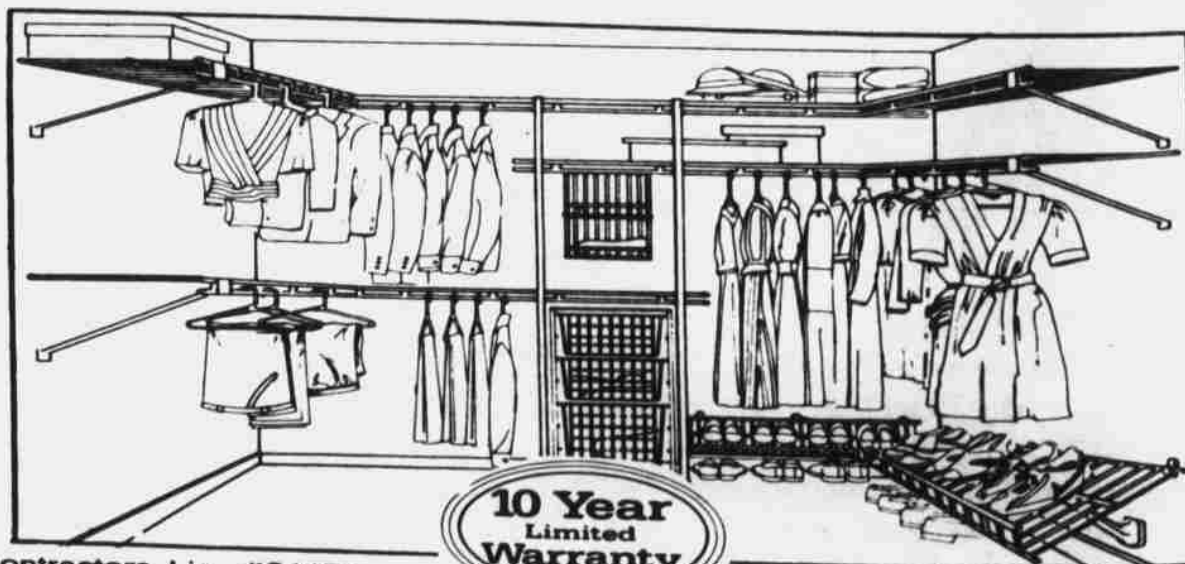
