

The gang has been linked to Hamas, a Moslem fundamentalist group that operates mainly in the Gaza Strip. Its victims, Avi Sasportas and Ilan Sa'adon, both from Ashkelon, are believed to have been abducted while hitching rides home from an IDF base near Gaza.

Sasportas had been missing since Feb. 16 when his remains were discovered on May 7, buried in a woods between the Hodaya and Givati junctions. Sa'adon, reported missing on May 3, has never been found. But

a manhunt for two years. Hassan, 20, was suspected of numerous Molotov cocktail assaults on Israeli vehicles in Kalkilya, and attacks on local Arabs whom he believed were cooperating with Israel.

The early morning shooting occurred in the Jordan Valley near Moshav Mehula, where an IDF patrol spotted two men acting suspiciously and the two were shot. Hassan was treated at the scene by a military doctor, but died of his wounds.

There have been numerous infiltration attempts from Jordan in recent months, so settlements in the vicinity were put on alert while the IDF searched the area. Nothing was found and the alert was canceled.
