These photos show the gradual deterioration of the great Jewish cemetery in Radin. The top photo is that of the gravesite of Rabbi Israel Meir Kagan, the famed author of Chafetz Chaim, as it appeared 50 years ago. The center photo depicts the same scene some 20 years ago. The adjoining synagogue of the previous photo is conspicously absent. The bottom photo was taken just weeks ago as colunteers attempted to identify the Rabbi's grace.

After verifying each case, the committee aided interested sponsoring groups by arranging for the cooperation of the Soviet authorities in the upgrading and maintenance of neglected Jewish cemeteries. Among the burial sites being repaired with the cooperation of government officials are those of some of eastern Europe's most famous rabbis, including that of the Chafetz Chaim.
