

BONN (JTA) - West Germany's Jewish community is putting pressure on the East German government to pay reparations to Jewish victims of Nazi persecution, for whom it has refused to acknowledge responsibility.

The community's chairman, Heinz Galinski, stressed in a radio interview recently that the political and moral responsibility for the Nazi past applies equally to both German states.

West Germany has paid out an estimated \$40 billion in reparations to Jews and to non-Jews, including Germans persecuted for their political

East Germany, however, has refused any payment, on the grounds that it is an anti-fascist state made up of persecutees, whereas the West German Federal Republic is the successor to
