January 21st — PROFESSOR MERVIN F. VER-BIT is Professor of Sociology at Brooklyn College, specializing in the sociology of religion and in Contemporary American Jewry. He has written extensively on Jewish identity, the Jewish family, Jewish education, and the role of religion in contemporary culture. He is co-author in the only empirical survey of Jewish attitudes in the Soviet Union, and is now working on a study of religion

and ethnicity among American Jewish university students. Dr. Verbit will speak on "Israel & Diaspora: How Are We One? How Are We Distinct?"

February 25th - YEHUDAH LEV is the Associate Editor of the Jewish Journal and teachers courses at the University of Judaism in Los Angeles. He immigrated to Israel in 1948 to serve in the War of Independence. He lived on a kibbutz before moving to Jerusalem where for many years he was correspondent for CBS and American newspapers. In the late 1960s he returned to the United States. With this extensive background, Mr. Lev will bring vital issues "up-tothe-hour" that involve the Jewish world such as the Jewish community, Jews around the Globe, Israel and the Middle East, and anti-Semitism. His subject will be "Jewish Current Events: What in the World is Going On?"

March 18th — RABBI ISAIAH ZELDIN founded the Stephen S. Wise Temple in Los Angeles in 1964, which has become the largest Jewish congregation in the West and second largest in the world. It is a complex of eleven buildings serving more than 2,800 families, with approximately 2,000 children in its various programs, including a fulltime Day School with grades K-8. The rabbi has been involved in academic life, sits on many local and national boards including the Zionist Organization of America, the UCLA Medical Ethics Committee, and the Board of Directors of the Hebrew Union College. He is a frequent contributor of articles on contemporary issues to newspapers and journals. His topic will be "Is Modern Judaism Becoming A Secular Religion".

April 29th — An hour at Masada with the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra, Zubin Mehta, the Choirs of Israel, welcomes by Israeli officials, the presentation of Prisoners of Zion living in Israel - and more! Four thousand people came from the four corners of the earth to the foot of the legendary fortress to witness the spectacular concert which was the grand finale of Israel's 40th Anniversary Celebration, reflecting the spirit of the Rebirth of

the Jewish State.
