The Hebrew Academy's plan for building a new state-of-the-art campus has been given an additional boost, thanks to a generous donation of \$50,000 from attorney George Rudiak and his wife Gertrude.

The Rudiak's, both long time area residents and enthusiastic supporters of the Academy, said that the school's academic level is excellent and that rapid local growth necessitates a new campus to better serve the community's children. Mrs. Rudiak described the school's principal, Dr. Tamar Lubin, as "a superb administrator" who consistently stays abreast of the latest academic programs.

The new facility is designed to handle an expanded curriculum and the inclusion of grades 9 through 12.
