PLO Executive Committee Begins Process Of Changing Covenant

NEW YORK, NY - The PLO Executive Committee took further steps recently toward compliance with the Oslo agreements by creating a committee to draft a replacement for the PLO covenant.

It appears that Palestinian Authority Chairman Yasir Arafat has the support of a majority of the Palestinian National Council (PNC) to comply with the Oslo requirements, as demanded by Israeli Prime Minister Shimon Peres.

Peres has stated that the covenant must be changed as a prerequisite to starting final status negotiations on Palestinian autonomy this spring. Arafat reaffirmed his commitment to change the covenant during his meeting with Secretary of State Warren Christopher earlier this month.
