With Improvements Will
Be More Right.

CONTRACTORS AT WORK

How the Creakers Will Sink
As Vegas Proudly Moves
Forward to its Goal.

THERE IS MORE GOOD THINGS IN STORE

Melville Sheldon & Co., of Los Angeles, the contractors for street grading, curbing and oiling of the streets, and for cutting of the permanent water ditch are on the ground. With a spirit that is cheering to the citizens, they have commenced a work that will be a lasting improvement and a blessing to the onward progress of Vegas.

On Wednesday afternoon the first ground was broken. The start was made on Main street, near the Hotel Las Vegas and from that point on the work will be pushed to a finality.

The contractors are bonded to complete their work in good style and in first-class workmanlike manner. The time in which they are to do the work is three months, not completed within the time specified they will be forfeiting to the townsite company for every day beyond date set for completion, a forfeit.

In the work will be employed some fifty men and twenty-five teams. Oil and mortar tanks and a six ton roller are on the ground and will be pressed into service with all dispatch to accomplish the work for which they are designed.

Main street and the railroad yards

will be graveled and later on oiled. The balance of the streets will be graded and oiled. The gentlemanly superintendent, Mr. Howard Tuttle, stated that not only will good work be done but that they propose to leave Vegas in such a condition as to impress the future resident that no such a thing as dust exists in Clark's Las Vegas.

The commencement of this work is a splendid answer to those croakers and kickers who have been yelping and bawling that all is lost.

The contractors are here, they are pushing the work and when they get through Vegas will be in better shape. This work is only a forerunner of the good things that are in store for our citizens.

Remember, Vegas is all right; will be all right and those newspapers so prolific in dark admonitions will simply take to the woods until their vision of the future of Vegas will have a better illumination.

FOR PROTECTION

The Attempt at Arson Provokes Vigilant Action by the Board of Trade.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETS

Appoints Working Committees to Look After Matters of Vital Importance.

CAUSTIC DENOUNCATION BY SQUIRES

The Board of Trade are at work. The foul and criminal attempt at arson on Friday evening was the means of summoning those workers for what is to the best interest of Vegas, to meet at the Hotel Las Vegas, Saturday evening.

The meeting was well attended and the first discussion was the attempt to set on fire the Chinese restaurant and the means to accomplish better protection for the property interests of this community. There is a woful lack of such protection at present. The gravity of this feature extorted vigorous expressions from such representatives as Kuhn, Fallas, Flemming, Eisenhart, Chief Lillis and C. P. Squires. Mr. Squires denounced the attempt to set on fire the restaurant as worse than a hold-up. He characterized a hold up as a gentleman compared with such a fiend.

The out come of this meeting was that the secretary was instructed to request the county commissioners to provide two additional police officers for Vegas, also a motion prevailed that the executive committee be empowered to immediately purchase an equipment to properly outfit the volunteer fire department and in the buying of same that Chief Lillis constitute an honorary member of the executive committee.

The secretary of the board of trade was also instructed to write the county superintendent of schools and urge a proper provision for the education and school facilities of the three hundred and sixteen enrolled school children of the district.

At the executive committee meeting of the board of trade on Sunday evening, much business was transacted. Judge Brennan, acted as secretary. On motion of Judge Percy, a committee of five was appointed to draw up articles of association and by-laws. The committee is Percy, Brennan, Parks, Clark, and Eisenhart. A committee on fire association was selected also viz: Reber, Wisner, Kuhn, Eisenhart and Clark. The promotion committee is Clark, Crowell and Eisenhart. Committee on transportation selected is Fred I. Kremer, F. L. Fallas and Dr. J. W. K. Bracken. Judge Brennan was appointed a committee of one upon looking into the advisability of adopting either mountain or Pacific time.

A wagon was donated by Mr. Robbins for horse hauler and Chief Lillis volunteered to see the lumber companies for lumber donations sufficient to build a suitable fire station.
