County Commissioner Baldwin Was in Vegas and Makes Known New Acts.

COUNTY PRINTING FOR LOWEST BIDDER

They Make Appropriations for Sinking a Well in Dry Lake District.

OUR PRAISEWORTHY COUNTY OFFICIALS

George C. Baldwin, one of the faithful and able county commissioners of Lincoln county, was in Vegas Tuesday. This popular official informs the Times that at the last sitting of the county board of supervisors, a rule was adopted that in future all county printing was to be awarded to the lowest bidder; also that the commissioners had made an appropriation of \$350. to be devoted to sinking a well for water in the Dry Lake belt between Las Vegas and Searchlight. The last session of the legislature appropriated \$1,000. for Lincoln county to be applied in securing a water station or stations along the arid routes of travel, but conditioned upon a basis that requires a flow of four barrels of water to every twenty-four hours before it can be applied for each spring. The county commissioners in response to the petitions made the appropriation to test for water to the end that this state fund may become operative and thus increase the water station to the south of Vegas.

The commissioners as faithful guardians of the interests of a people acted wisely in making this appropriation for preliminary tests. The locating and securing an ample supply of water along this route means much for the prospectors and the upbuilding of Lincoln county resources. The expenditure of this money in a judicious application to facilitate travel and development will bring returns manifold.

This entire valley is underlaid with good clear water and in assisting the development of the same the county officials are deserving of praise. In the good work Commissioners George Baldwin, J. A. Nesbitt and Dick Gordon were good actors.

POSTAL SERVICE.

Additional and Efficient Help is Installed.

Post Master Bracken, has determined that the postal services of Vegas must keep abreast with public requirements notwithstanding the inadequate provisions for the same by the federal government. To the end of carrying out this policy of public spirit on his part he has increased the working force of the government station by employing assistants Mrs. C. C. Rowan and Miss May Wadsworth, two bright and intelligent ladies who have had experience in the postal department of the government heretofore. Mrs. Rowan, has had charge of the postal service at Panama and Callente this state.

Vegas is having a volume of business that entitles it to more than a fourth-class rate and it is unfair to the present postmaster that he should be required personally to bear the burden of supplying the community with the service required.
