I left Provo, this morning and the boys were waiting me at the depot at Heber. The fair from Provo to Heber for the round trip was \$1 65, one way \$1.05. I got a return. The railroad runs through a canon and it takes the Denver and Rio Grande railroid, about two and one half hours to make the run. It is realy a most delightful country and the lands are cultivated, every inch of it. The country is in reality a beautifu' paradise.

I may return to Provo with him, so the cost o the trip going and coming out again will only amount to \$10. for the eight days. The team is a good one in fact the best I have seen and they make good time.

We have to travel nineteen miles to react the servation and it is through s canon from the time you leave Heber till you reach the top of the divide and it is a hummer. Although being a hummer, so far as activity is concerned in is also a garden spot from beginnig to

Prices are not high here, but it would be advisable for whoever comes in to examine lands to oufit completely-and not depend on getting anything at all on the inside, for if you do, there is where you are going to bump against the real thing.

I learn that the certificates issued by commissioner at Provo is not sufficient to admit land seekers into the reservation, so its well to know that all who desire to come that after they reach the reservation, nineteen miles from Heber. let them report at the government post to the officer at that point who will countereign the document issued at Provo and that wil give him the same courtsey now being enjoyed by the big mining corporations
