Lobster's Bad Character.

The Scotch fishery board in its wenty-third annual report gives the following as the characteristics of the lobster. When once they have settled down, however, they will live at peace with one another, but it is only an armed neutrality, and if one of the fish ever loses its fighting power it is at once attacked by the others.-American Shipping.

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

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
