Up these stacks in 1899 went \$72,000, which it cost to erect the mill which was to treat the ore of the Columbia copper mine by the ammenia process. In the laboratory the theory worked to a charm, but in operation the mill proved a failure, extracting only one-fifth of the copper. The ore was all right, but the mill was all wrong, and the camp got a black eye by the failure of a theorist whose dream would not work out in practice. Prof. Hirsching of Salt Lake was the theorist and eastern capitalists put up the cash and got the experience.

Mr. J. F. Kent, manager of the Yellow Pine Mining Co., purchased the silent mill at sheriff's sale for a song, and will convert it into a concentrator mines around Good Springs.
