AT INDIAN CREEK Las Vegas & Tonopah Establishes Station There

Monday last, President J. Ross Clark, Supt. T. B. Cullen, of the Salt Lake, Supt. F. M. Grace, of the new line, and Walter R. Bracken passed over the Los Vegas & Tonopah in the first coach LoT for sale on Wilson avenue, Rag-town, for balf its cost. Enquire at this 1000 feet; the elevation here 2000 feet. to teach within two miles of Indian Creek.

On the Saturday previous two miles of track had been laid. The line has now reached Indian Creek, and a station and Y are being built to accommodate freight and passenger business.




