Beatty Will Have Largest Plant in Southwest

Los Angeles Mining Review says:

It is learned on reliable authority that Mr. Chas, Schwab intends to erect a 200-stamp mill at the Montgomery-Shoshone mine at Beatty, of which he has recently acquired a controlling in- FOR RENT-Or will lease for a term

The mill will be of heavy construction with 1000-pound stamps. It has not yet been decided whether concentrators will be installed, or whether the tailings will be cyanided.

It is stated that timber suitable for mill construction has been found within reach of Beatty, and that all timbers and lumber for construction of the mill will be cut there and hauled to the mine, this being cheaper than to ship fir timbers from Los Angeles. To this end a saw mill has already been ordered and will be shipped to Beatty. It will be set up immediately upon


