### CRESCENT

The foam and floaters and blowhards have departed from Crescent, but the great ledges remain and sturdy men are developing them. A dozen good prospects promise to become producing gold and silver mines.

Crescent has plenty of water and a good climate.

A telephone line is building from Nipton to Crescent and thence to Searchlight.

The Age will have more to say in the near future concerning Crescent mines.

Milton Mundy, manager of the Toltec Gem Mining Co., of Crescent, has been working a force in the turquoise mines. The product goes to Chas. F. Wood & Co., New York. For ten years the mines have been worked by white men, and centuries ago by Indians, who left their stone implements on the ground as mute witnesses.

The elevation of Nipton, on the Salt Lake railroad, is 3,000 feet above sea. Altitude at Crescent, five miles east of Nipton 4,210 feet, and the summit four miles beyond Crescent is 5,000 feet above sea. This heavy grade stands in the way of construction of the railroad to Searchlight. It may be overcome by switchbacks or winding detours. The important mines are all on the Crescent or west side of the range, and it will be easy to run ore down from Crescent mines to Nipton by gravity tramway.

Crescent has an abundant supply of good water. Years ago the Legal Tender Mining Company had a five-stamp mill at Crescent, and the well supplied water. Later it was used by the Rock Springs Cattle Company for watering cattle.

A force of men has been put to work developing the Red Star mine.

### PLANTING TREES

The Nevada Northern Railway Company has made application to the Forest Service for assistance in establishing experimental forest stations along the line of the 150-mile road it is building from the Southern Pacific in Elko county to Ely, White Pine county. The plantations will be made at each of the water tanks to determine what trees can be ground to advantage and by what methods. The general aim is to encourage the settlement of the region by demonstrating that the lands are of agricultural value, or will at least produce timber.
