COPPER

Interesting Information on Various Points

In connection with the location of several copper prospects in this section the following miscellaneous notes will be of interest:

The exports of copper from the United States in gross tons for 1904 were 247,735 tons, and for 1905 259,863 tons.

Nineteen cents a pound is today the price of copper, and Boston authorities state that it will be twenty cents almost immediately.

That the price of copper will remain at nineteen and twenty cents is to be doubted. Authorities think that it should, and will, fall a couple of points.

Copper producers are straining every resource to increase their output, and the copper areas are being diligently explored for new mines. They are needed—nor can too many be found.

In judging the market it must never be forgotten that the demand for copper is not merely due to expansion of industry, but to the application of an economy to many industries.

Arizona's production of copper for the year 1905 amounted to 241,000,000 pounds. This makes Arizona a good second on the list of America's copper producers. The figures for last year show that during the last eleven years the Territory has increased its output of copper something like 600 per cent.

Locators May Relocate

Recently there was rendered in the District Court at Boulder, Colo., an important decision in the matter of relocating mining claims. It is the first case of the kind in this State, and has an important bearing on mining litigation. The court held that locators of mining claims who have failed to do the annual assessment work prescribed by law in order to hold title to same have the right to relocate, the same as any other party who may jump the claims after the first location becomes void by reason of failure to perform the necessary work. The court held that the relocation would hold good at law, providing it was made before the location by other parties after the first location had become void.

This it seems is no more than just; it does not deprive anyone from locating—the locator must, of course, exercise due diligence and locate prior to relocation on the part of the first claimant.

Where districts are settling up rapidly and the ground assumes value of an increasing character, no man is likely to allow his work to fail—if so, he takes the chance of losing his property, for, while he may have the right to relocate, his negligence in the first instance will likely be repeated in the second, and he will forfeit his rights in the one case just as he does in the other.—Ores and Metals.
