CONSOLIDATION

Pending Between Clark and Goldfield Lines

The Salt Lake and Bullfrog-Goldfield railroad official are still sparring for points in the pending consolidation between the north and south lines. The Brock people have taken possession of good passes on the Amargosa river route, and graders are working 15 miles south of Goldfield and in the pass between Beatty and Gold Center. A good route has been found by the Brock engineers to reach Thorp's Mills, which is near Gold Mountain.

The Clark railroad is endeavoring to find an easy grade from Rhyolite via Gold Bar, Gold Mountain, Lida and other camps. So far no good route north, except through the Amargosa Valley, has been discovered. Other grades are too steep for transcontinental roads. All main lines must pass through Beatty if they want good grades. Branches will extend from the Amargosa river line to the sister camps.—Beatty Miner.

GOOD SHOWING

Four Nevada Counties Have No Delinquent Tax List

All the taxpayers of White Pine and Douglas counties have paid in full, making four counties that will not have a delinquent list this year. Elko and Eureka are the other two.

In Lincoln county only six names appear on the delinquent list, and Storey county shows the same number.

Reduced Rates

All the railroads announce a reduction of passenger rates per mile in six of the Western States and two Territories. In Nevada the passenger rate will be 4 cents; in Idaho the rate will be 3 cents instead of 4 on the main line; in portions of Wyoming and Colorado 3 cents instead of 4; in Nevada, Arizona and New Mexico the main line rates will be 4 instead of 5 cents; in Utah, on certain main lines, 3 instead of 4 cents.

New Reduction Process

A strong company has been formed to manufacture and operate a new ore reduction process discovered by S. E. Clawson, a Utah mining man, who has been working in Nevada. Clawson claims to have found a method of treating silicious ores with his process so that \$5 ores can be handled at a profit. He proposes to pulverize a high grade of fuel coal very finely and drive this into a furnace under strong pressure in order to obtain a high degree of heat at small cost. The intense heat, he says, volatilizes the ore, and the chlorides, as vapor, are drawn off and precipitated. They are then reduced to bullion in the usual way.

NEVADA'S GROWTH

Southern Portion Shows the Greatest Gain

One hundred and sixty-five thousand is the News' estimate of the population of Nevada in 1910 when the next census will be taken.

This is a conservative figure as will be shown by the appended figures:

In 1900 the population was but a trifle over 42,000, the smallest number shown in any census since Nevada was a territory.

Since that time few, if any, counties remained stationary, but, for the sake of argument, let them be named as Ormsby, Storey, Douglas, Humboldt, Lyon, Eureka and Elko. They have continued to uphold their quota of the 42,000.

In the meantime Reno has grown from 2500 to 12,000 and Sparks from nothing to 3000, making a gain for Washoe of 10,500.

Churchill had in 1900 no Fallon, no East Gate, no reclaimed lands. Put Churchill county's advance in six years at 4000.

Lyon county's mines were unworked and Yerrington was a country cross roads, known as Pizen Switch, when the census was taken. The advance in that county may be estimated at 1500.

White Pine county has had a growth of about 1000.

Many towns have sprung up in Lincoln county, and what in 1900 were mere names upon the map are now thriving villages. Give Lincoln a boost of 6000, half of which belongs to Searchlight district.

There was neither Tonopah, Manhattan nor Round Mountain in Nye county in the year of our Lord 1900. Score 10,000 for Nye. Then add 5000 more for the Bullfrog country.

Esmeralda has 6000 people in Goldfield and 1500 in Columbia and Diamondfield, where there were none in 1900. 1000 is a low estimate for Lida and Palmetto with a 1000 scattered prospectors.

The counties named as stationary, or nearly so, will record a combined increase in six years of 2500.

This makes a growth in six years, carelessly estimated, of 50,000, or a total population at present of 92,000.

Should the proportionate increase of 119 per cent be continued for the remaining four years before the next census is taken, the increase, two-thirds of 119 per cent upon 92,000, would be 79 per cent of that number, or 73,000, making a total of 165,000.—Carson News.
